




In great Shapes

Mark Rayner gives an old pot a jazzy makeover.

You will need

- Bucket of warm soapy water and sponge.
 Resene Lumbersider tinted to Resene
- Large concrete (or terracotta*) pot.
- Low-tack masking tape.
- Paintbrushes.
- Resene Concrete Primer*.
- Resene Lumbersider finted to Resene Flashback, Resene Desperado and Resene Milk Chocolate.
- Resene Sun Defier acrylic UV protective glaze.





Wash the concrete pot with warm soapy water and rinse well. Allow to dry.



Apply one coat of Resene Concrete Primer to the pot, allowing two hours to dry.



Apply two coats of Resene Flashback to the pot, allowing two hours for each coat to dry.



Apply low-tack masking tape to the sides of the pot, as shown, to create a series of random geometric shapes.



Paint alternate shapes with two coats of Resene Desperado, allowing two hours for the first coat to dry.



Paint remaining shapes with two coats of Resene Milk Chocolate, allowing two hours for the first coat to dry.



Before the second coat of each colour has dried, carefully remove the masking tape and allow paint two hours to dry.



Apply a coat of Resene Sun Defier and allow two hours to dry before planting up with potted colour.
