### You will need:

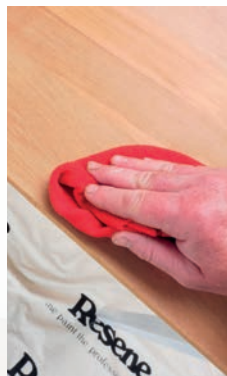
- Clean cloth
- Mineral turps for washing brushes
- Old wooden side table
- Paintbrushes
- Resene Qristal Clear polyurethane
- Resene Danska Teak Oil
- Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene Code Red, or use Resene Enamacryl for a waterborne enamel finish
- Resene Wood Primer
- Sandpaper



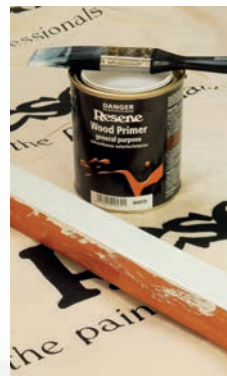
**Step one**  
Remove the old plastic covering from the table top.



**Step two**  
Sand the entire table, ensuring any old varnish is completely removed.



**Step three**  
Wipe off any sanding residue with a clean cloth.



**Step four**  
Apply one coat of Resene Wood Primer to all parts of the table excluding the top. Allow to dry.



**Step five**  
Apply one coat of Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene Code Red to all parts of the table excluding the top. Allow to dry.



**Step six**  
Apply a second coat of Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene Code Red and allow to dry.



**Step seven**  
Apply one coat of Resene Danska Teak Oil to the table top and allow to dry.

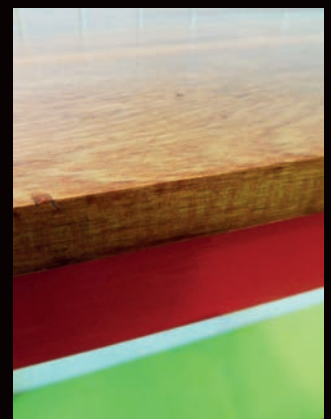


**Step eight**  
Apply three coats of Resene Qristal Clear polyurethane to the table top ensuring each coat is dry before applying the next.

Transform a drab wooden side table into a high gloss treasure with a little bit of help from Resene.



**To get the look:**  
Mark painted the background tongue and groove with Resene Lustacryl tinted to Resene Soft Mint.



**Other ideas:**  
For a striking black effect use Resene Super Gloss tinted to Resene All Black.
