FACTORS such as gender, age, and culture can influence how an individual feels about certain colours.



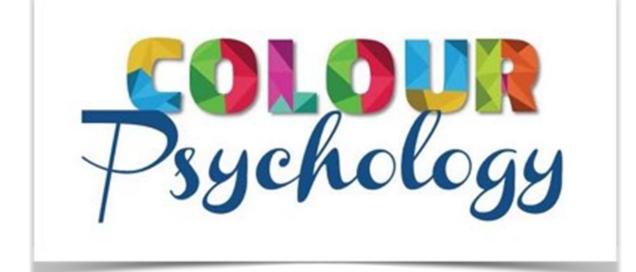

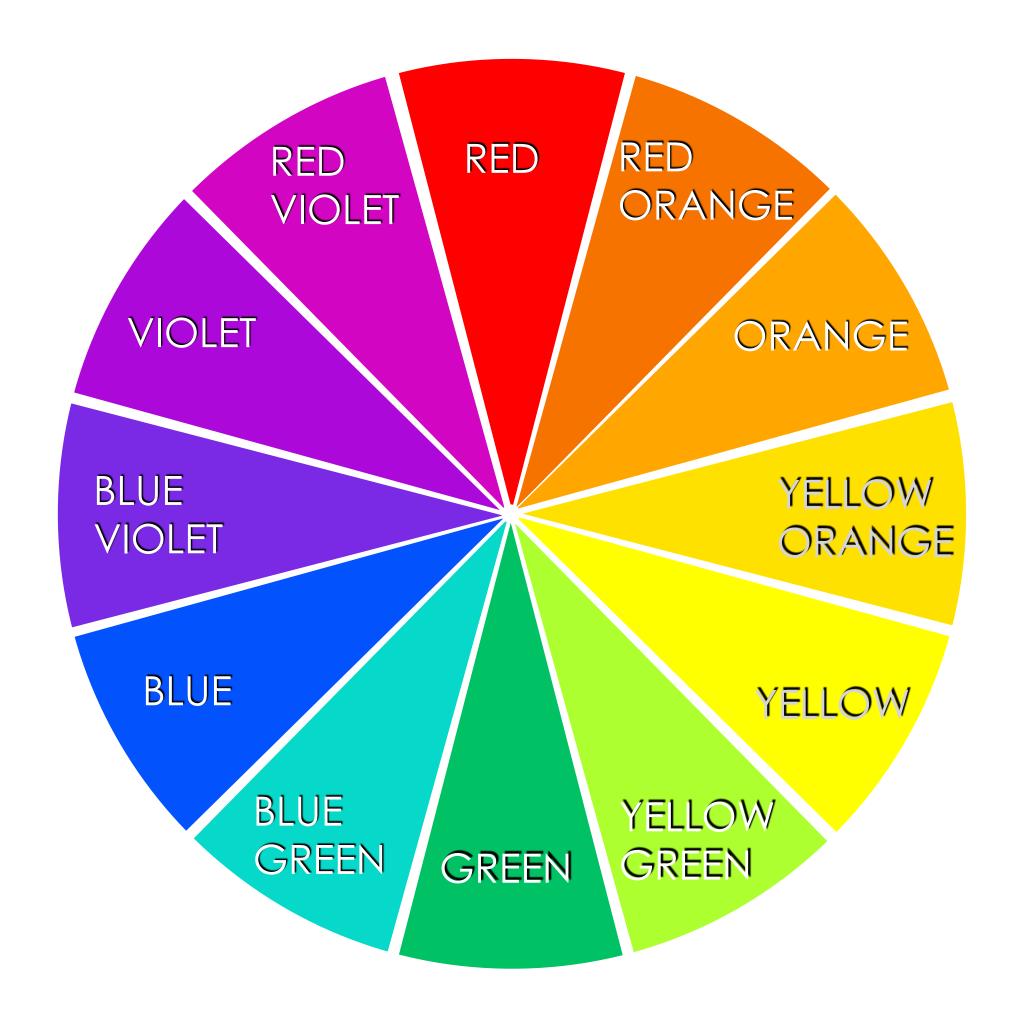








Colour Wheel

The Real Neutrals



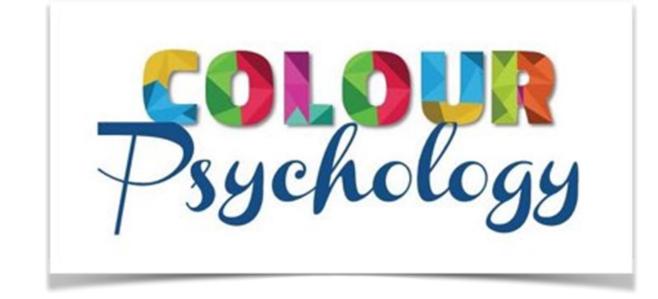




Black, Grey and White do not appear on the colour wheel as they are not considered to be colour.





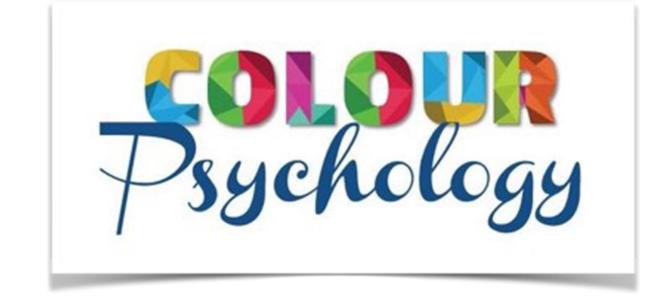




The 'Mock' Neutrals

The neutral you have when you aren't having a neutral.







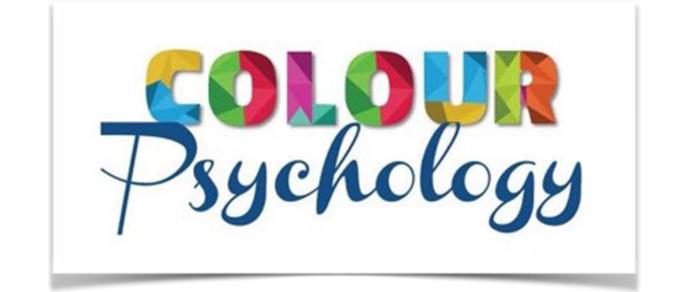

are actually COLOUR mixed with white, black or grey ... this is called 'neutralizing' the colour.

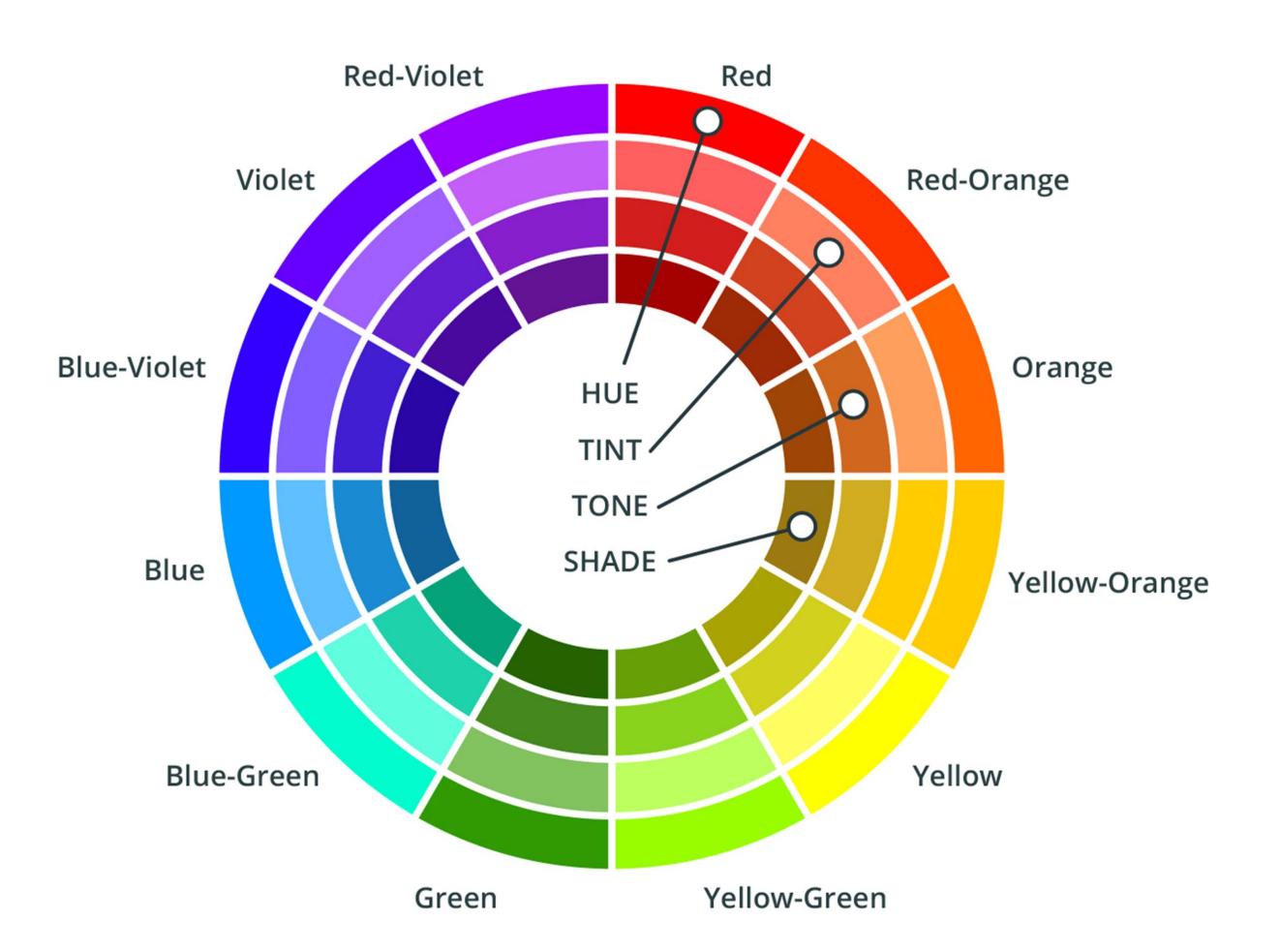




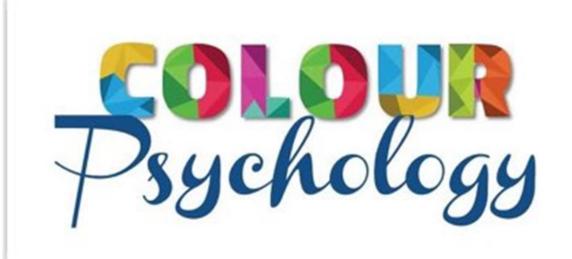
